OUR STORY

Pampas — meaning "plain", are fertile grass lands in Argentina that produce some of the world's most sought after beef and allow the country to be one of the largest agricultural exporters in the world. This is also where the gauchos [cowboys] roamed and left a tremendous mark on the history and the culture of the country.

During the late 1800s when it came to leather and horses no one could do it better than the Argentines. Horses, their tack, their work [cattle] and their sport [polo] were important aspects to Argentine life and so were the gauchos who trained and cared for these prestigious animals. These men were also amazing craftsman who developed beautiful pieces by hand — horse bridles, stirrups, boots, belts, ponchos and knives. Still today these items are one of Argentina's greatest treasures.

The art of the gauchos has been beautifully mastered over the generations and is still produced by hand in regions throughout Argentina. Pampas Life works directly with these craftsmen and with local artists to provide a luxury, handcrafted and functional product for you and your home.





The famous Patagonian region of Argentina is a combination of two very different worlds: the Andean mountains to the west and the Patagonia steppe to the east. This majestic place with snow covered mountain peaks, crystal clear lakes and dense colored forests has been a sought after destination since Magellan took his first steps here in 1520. The land, its people and the wildlife contribute greatly to its beauty and sustainability. This signature collection is not only inspired by Patagonia, but it also represents elements found within the region - naturally fallen deer antlers, the traditional usage of deer horn by the indigenous people to make tools and the simple beauty of Patagonia.



STEAK KNIFE

Considered the widest river in the world sitting on the border of Argentina and Uruguay is the Rio de La Plata [Silver River]. It was discovered by the Portuguese in 1512, but named 24 years later by the Italian explorer, Cabot, when he discovered silver trinkets in the river. Now this river supports the largest shipping port in South America, Buenos Aires Port, and the name perfectly suits our sleek, high polished, and all stainless steel steak knife.




